Convention Registration and Online Program will be Available in July 2019

Online convention registration will open July 1, 2019. You can review the registration rates, and what is included with registration, on the convention <u>Registration Information</u> webpage. NCA is pleased to offer the following discounted/special registrations rates again in 2019.

- Guest Speaker Registration: Attendees who were invited to participate in a session based on their expertise in an area outside of the discipline may receive a complimentary registration. Guest speakers are people who would not normally attend the convention, and are and never have been members of NCA. Guest Speakers must register in advance by completing and submitting the <u>Guest Speaker Request Form</u> before October 11, 2019.
- K-12 Educators Pass: Active K-12 educators will receive free registration. Attendees must register onsite at the NCA Registration Area and show a valid school ID.
- Friends and Family: Spouses, partners, family members, and friends are welcome at the convention and may register for a flat rate of \$50. The Friends and Family registration grants access to all areas, sessions, and events at the convention. This registration type does not apply to individuals who are in the discipline, who are

or ever have been members of NCA, or who are on the convention program. Friends and family must register onsite at the NCA Registration Area.

The online convention program will be available in July on <u>NCA Convention Central</u>. Accept and decline notifications will be sent via e-mail to submitters by the NCA Program Planners at the end of June.
