Welcome from the First Vice President

I am so looking forward to seeing you at the NCA Convention in Baltimore later this month. As you already probably know, this year's theme, "Communication for Survival," encourages Communication scholars and practitioners alike to think about the vital role communication plays in survival. You and many of your colleagues have submitted remarkable proposals relating to the convention theme, proposals for sessions, short courses, preconferences, film screenings, and more. Before we convene in Baltimore, I would like to note just a few events highlights at this year's convention:

- Using the card provided in your convention materials upon arrival, introduce yourself to five people you don't
 know (preferably newcomers to the Annual Convention), write their names on the card, and bring your card to
 the registration area to receive your "Mentor Pin." Final step: Wear your mentor pin proudly throughout the
 convention and beyond!
- NCA Opening Session: Race Relations in Charm City: Communicating Social Justice, sponsored by the Waterhouse Family Institute for the Study of Communication and Society.
- · Communication for Survival Spotlight Series:
 - Communication and Surviving in the Anthropocene: Keywords focuses on what the discipline of
 Communication may offer to consider how we entered this era of consequential anthropogenic climate
 change, the barriers we face to transform our culture, and which voices might help us bring about a
 more just and sustainable future.
 - <u>Communication, Disability Justice, and Surviving Ableism</u> will examine the centrality of communication practices to the pursuit of disability justice through anti-abelist scholarship and activism.
 - Communicating Survival in Violent Times: A Dialogue on the Intersections of Violence in Gendered, Sexual, Racial/Ethnic, and Class Contexts will feature larger conversations about domestic violence, gendered violence, and racial/ethnic violence utilizing an intersectional lens.
 - <u>Communication and Surviving Environmental Racism</u> features the work of Destiny Watford, a Goldman Environmental Prize winner and one of *TIME Magazine's* Next Generation Leaders, and Communication scholars discussing research on related themes of voice and social movements, racial ecologies, and urban organizing.
 - Communication and # ing While Black or Brown addresses experiences of hashtag activism but focuses specifically on the role of communication and that of our discipline as a means of constructing narratives around #___ing while black or brown.
- <u>Carroll C. Arnold Distinguished Lecture</u>, sponsored by Pearson, which will be delivered by Dr. Lisa Flores, from
 the University of Colorado, Boulder. A powerful scholar who has helped to shape the field of Communication in
 significant ways, Dr. Flores' talk will focus on "Mobility, Containment, and the Racialized Spatio-Temporalities of
 Survival."
- NCA Presidential Address and Awards Presentation, sponsored by Routledge, Taylor & Francis. NCA
 President Star Muir will present "The Coming Dark Age and the Future of Scholarly Associations."

In closing, I am so excited about this year's convention and hope you and your students, friends, family, and colleagues have a wonderful experience, one that energizes you, helps you think and act in new and powerful ways, and ultimately helps us all find ways communication can facilitate survival.

NCA Day of Service

For the third consecutive year, NCA will be hosting a Day of Service, sponsored by Kendall Hunt, on Wednesday, November 13. This year, we will be offering an on-site and an off-site session.

Part One will be putting together bags of school necessities such as pencils, notebooks, and folders, for children in Baltimore. This session will take place 11:00 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. in Holiday Ballroom 1, 2nd floor of the Hilton Baltimore. The bags of supplies will be donated to the Boys & Girls Club of Metropolitan Baltimore (BGCMB). We will be assembling 500 bags of school supplies, so every little bit of time you can give to the effort will help. Please stop by for as long as you are able. Registration is not required, but we do encourage anyone interested to sign up with our Facebook event. There is no registration fee for Part One of the NCA Day of Service.

<u>Part Two</u> will be at the Boys & Girls Club of Metropolitan Baltimore (BGCMB). BGCMB serves more than 500 young people at one of its club locations. Attendees will be helping the Club with needed projects and will be donating the assembled bags from Part One. Transportation to and from the Hilton Baltimore and lunch will be provided for Part Two attendees. There is a \$20 registration fee, but that will be refunded following the convention to all who attend the Day of Service Part Two.

You can register for Part Two of the NCA Day of Service when you register for the convention. If you have already registered for the convention and would like to add the Day of Service session to your registration, you can do so by logging into your NCA membership account, clicking the "my account" link at the top of the page, clicking the "purchases" tab, selecting the "events" section, clicking the "details" button next to your convention registration, selecting the "add session" button, and then selecting the NCA Day of Service Off-Site at the Boys & Girls Club session.

Navigating the Convention Locations

Please review the following information to help you navigate your way around the convention sessions. Convention programming is scheduled in the Baltimore Convention Center and the Hilton. NCA Registration and the Exhibit Hall will be located in the Baltimore Convention Center. General sessions will be located in the Hilton.

Navigating the Hilton

The meeting space in the Hilton is separated into an east and west tower. The towers are connected within the hotel on the second floor. The hotel lobby is in the west tower; sessions that take place on the first floor are in the east tower. The Key Ballrooms are in the west tower on the second floor. The Holiday Ballrooms are in the east tower. Sessions on the third floor are in the west tower. If you are going from a session on the first floor to the third floor of the Hilton, you will need to either exit the hotel on the first floor, walk across the street to the hotel lobby and then travel up to the third floor; or go up to the second floor, cross the enclosed skywalk from the east tower to the west tower, and then travel up to the third floor. The skybridge access from the Hilton to the Baltimore Convention Center is located on the second floor near the Poe room.

The meeting rooms in the Baltimore Convention Center (BCC) are on the 300 and 400 levels. The BCC is connected to the Hilton by an enclosed skybridge. Please note that the entrance to the BCC via the skybridge is open only when there are ongoing sessions and events in the BCC. The door will be locked 30 minutes after the last session or event of the day is completed. The skybridge access from BCC is located on the 300 level.
